### **Pastor's Column**

I watched a program the other night about the efforts of some people in a community to build a radically new kind of residential nursing facility for the elderly that was more home-like and less clinical. It included a vision of a place where the residents (referred to as "elders") were honored and encouraged to participate, where appropriate, in the household tasks of daily living. The community leaders championing this residence had a vision and a dream. But the journey to realize that dream was long and hard. There were legislative issues to overcome, endless meetings, and fundraising challenges. And then came the downturn in the economy which put all their plans on hold for a time.

The residence did eventually get built amid much celebration. But the program raised for me the awareness of how much humdrum, tedious, and unglamorous aspects there are to pursuing a dream or living out a calling. Ministry does not always come with warm fuzzy feelings. It is often made up of a lot of ordinary grunt work.

This program brought to my mind the ministries many of us at UPC are engaged in. A lot of what lies behind our ministries is rarely flashy, glamorous, or even evident to the casual observer. People put in a lot of work behind the scenes to make an event or a program or a service happen.

As we close our regular program year schedule for the more relaxed pace of summer, I want to thank all the folks in our congregation who do so much of the behind the scenes ministry. These efforts bring so much benefit to so many people. Scripture tells us that the realm of God often comes in ordinary forms and is often hidden from view. Thank you to all at UPC whose efforts have been part of the realm of God!

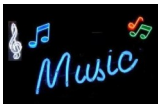
