#### Pastor's Column

What story shapes your life? Turn on the television or read the paper and you will find an abundance of sad and tragic stories. Our criminal justice system is filled with cases of perpetrators whose own backgrounds are a litany of abuse and neglect. Some people's entire lives are shaped by events that took place when they were young. Some of us never get over a single moment that occurred in our lives.

The Church is supposed to be a place where we can be honest about our stories of pain and brokenness. And yet, too often we mask these realities from others. In the various congregations I have served, I have run into a good number of individuals who have been reluctant to share with others at church about their own story of struggle or hardship. They incorrectly believe that everyone else in the congregation "has their lives together." And yet I know that you don't have to scratch very far beneath the surface to discover that we all are carrying around stories of pain, sorrow, and brokenness.

Easter is the time of year when we are reminded that we Christians live and die by a very special story. We tell the story of Life in the face of Death. The God who knows our pain and struggle, who indeed came to *share* this story with us, who chose to get embroiled in humanity's evil and brokenness—this God is the God of Life. This God raises up even the dead. God knows our stories and cares about them. And rather than leaving us abandoned to the tragedies of our stories, God gives us another story to shape and define our lives. Easter is our story. May the joy of this story be yours this Easter!



The Peace Corps traces its roots and mission to 1960, when then Senator John F Kennedy challenged University of Michigan students to serve their country in the cause of peace by living and working in developing countries.

Since that time, 200,000+ Peace Corps Volunteers have served in 139 host countries to work on issues ranging from AIDS education to information technology and environmental preservation.

Today's Peace Corps is more vital than ever, working in emerging and essential areas such as information technology and business development, and contributing to the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief. Peace Corps Volunteers continue to help countless individuals who want to build a better life for themselves, their children, and their communities.

On April 22nd, we will host 3 UPC members, who agreed with John Kennedy. They went out and served others in the cause of peace. This is certainly a very Christian view of the world. Come and find out how the Peace Corp has changed over its 50 year history. Ginna Coons served in the 1960's, during the founding years. Tim Harbison served during the 1980's and Ben Wixson served during the start of the 21st century.

### **Lunch for University Student Fellowship**

The Ministry with University Students Committee invites members of the congregation **to provide lunch** <u>or</u> **funding** to cover the cost of lunch for the University Student Fellowship on Sundays at 12:15.

A donation of \$30 will cover lunch for one Sunday. Payment is needed one week in advance and may be submitted via the offering plate with a designation for "University Student Lunches."

If preparing a meal, one person may bring the main course, another dessert and beverage, or one person may bring the entire meal. Though the number of students varies, please plan food for 8-10.

Simple foods work best. For the main course, sandwich fixings, a crockpot of chili or soup, or a casserole would be ideal. For dessert, fruit is an option, and other desserts need not be homemade. A 2-liter bottle of pop is the perfect beverage. Paper products and cutlery are provided, so you need not bring those. However, a ladle is appreciated for soup or chili.

This year we have a vegetarian student and one who has a gluten allergy, so it would be helpful to take this into consideration when preparing meals. Perhaps meat could be served separately and at least some components of the meal could be gluten-free.

Those who provide the lunch are encouraged to eat with the students.

There is a sign-up sheet in the Holzwarth Room for the fall semester. Please help us fulfill our mission of ministering to the university students in our midst by facilitating their fellowship over lunch before they begin their weekly study topic.
