Pastor's Column

This Advent season, University Church has launched a "Fill the Stable" campaign to raise money for Heifer International. Heifer is an organization that seeks to lift people around the globe from poverty through the gift of livestock. The cows, sheep, goats, ducks, chickens, etc. generate food and income for impoverished families, giving the gift of sustainability rather than a one-time handout of aid. One of the core values of Heifer is that a family will pass on the offspring of their livestock to another family in their community.

Many of our members make donations to Heifer as an alternative gift to family members and friends. What could be more meaningful than a gift that could substantially improve a person's life?

Our "Fill the Stable" campaign seeks to raise \$1640: the cost of purchasing a donkey, a sheep, a heifer, a flock of chicks, and a camel—all those animals we traditionally think of as being present in the stable at the birth of Jesus. It's a lot of money, but I think we can do it!

The campaign to "Fill the Stable," however, is more than just a fund-raiser for a good cause. It is also a theological theme for our season of Advent. The incarnation of Christ was about filling the empty places in our hearts and lives with the tangible love of God. In Advent, we acknowledge our emptiness and the yearning we have to be filled. We confess our efforts to fill our lives with all those false things which never provide lasting meaning. And we rejoice in the coming gift of Christ—the one whose life and sacrifice have filled us with good things.

And now, in the spirit of Heifer's values, we pass on the gift. Let us "fill the stable" for others with tangible signs of God's love.

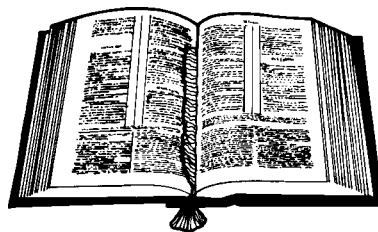

Denise researches and gathers all of the information she uses about each historical portrayal and writes a story that reflects the unique life.

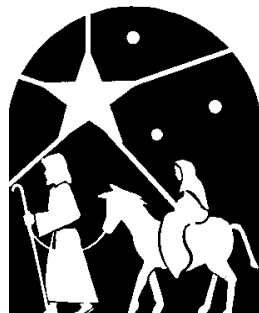
Each tale reveals many historical accounts using vivid details and authentic material. All this takes shape in a 35 minute performance presented in characterization and costume.

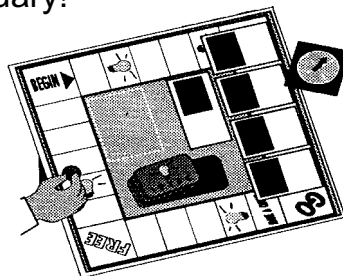
“The Good, the Bad and the Ugly: The Bible and Christian Faith”

What are we to do about difficult parts of the Bible, such as those which depict infant sacrifice or genocide in God's name? All of these questions and more will be addressed in this series.

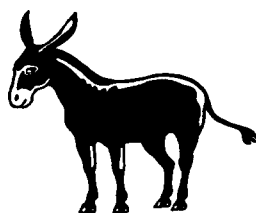


Help UPC “Fill the Stable”
