Pastor's Column

Waiting is something we all do in life. The most annoying kind to me is waiting at the doctor's office. First you wait in the waiting room. Then you wait in the examining room. And you never know how long it will take until you are seen. When I'm stuck in one of these situations, I notice that there are some folks who come prepared for the wait, armed with books, magazines, knitting or other distractions. And then there are others who just sit, or snooze, or endure the wait. Either way, this kind of waiting is pretty passive. We are just biding our time until our name is called and the wait is over.

Then there is the other kind of waiting which is more active. It's the kind of waiting we do when we know that house guests are coming to stay with us in two days time. We spend this "in-between" time getting ready for their visit: cleaning the house, buying the food, arranging the guest room, etc. We use this waiting time preparing for what is about to happen.

This is the kind of waiting we are invited to do in Advent: a time of active, intentional preparation. I think Advent, shrunk as it is into just 4 weeks, is supposed to mirror life. Life could be considered an "in-between" time. It's the time spent between our births and our deaths. How will we spend this time? Are we actively preparing for Christ's coming in our lives each day? Are we doing those things that will help us recognize God's presence? Are we getting ready to usher in God's new realm of peace, justice, and hope by the ways we spend our time, money, and efforts? Do we live with the anticipation that Christ is about to be born in our hearts and lives?

I invite you to join in this Advent season of active waiting and preparing so that we can carry this kind of waiting into the rest of our lives. You will discover in this Network many events and services that can help assist us in this preparation of our hearts and lives for the coming of Christ.

What would I do?

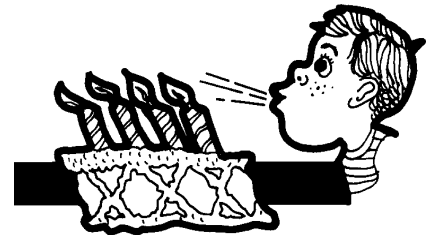
- You would work with 3 or 4 other volunteers.

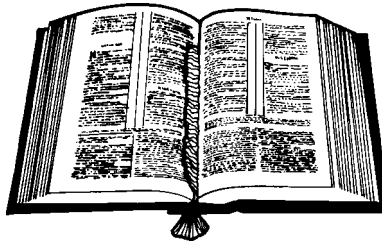

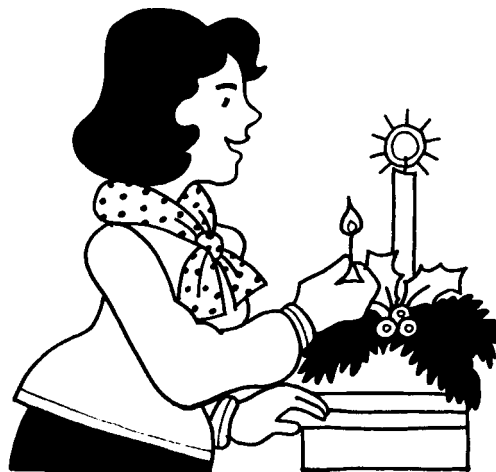

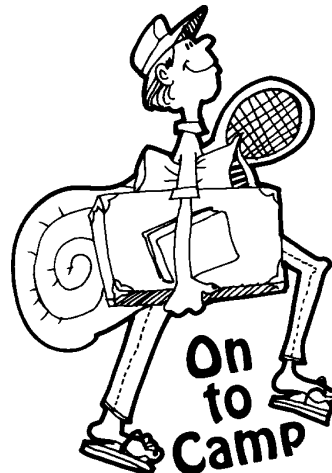

Our member interview for the month of December will be Bill Rugg.

Bill and his wife Marj transferred their membership to UPC from Central Presbyterian when they closed their doors.

Bill was born and raised in the Kensington-Bailey area of Buffalo where he attended PS#78 and Kensington High School. He then graduated from Syracuse University with a degree in Civil Engineering. Growing up, he and his family regularly attended and were very active in United Church of Christ. Bill and Marj were married in Mac Alpine Presbyterian Church where Marj's family was members.

Upon graduation from Syracuse, Bill joined the Army Corps of Engineers and served two years during the Korean War and was discharged as a Staff Sergeant. After leaving the service he returned to Buffalo where he worked for an Engineering Firm designing the High Level Bridge (Buffalo Skyway) and 13 railroad bridges in Niagara County. After 3 years as a bridge designer, he joined the engineering firm of Krehbiel and Krehbiel. After his third year at the firm he became an associate and after ten years was made a partner in the firm Krehbiel, Guay, Rugg and Hall. During his career he later became President and was the CEO of the firm until he retired.

Bill and Marj enjoyed traveling after retirement. Unfortunately eight years ago Marj developed dementia, and since then Bill has been her care giver until she was admitted to Weinberg Nursing Home almost two years ago. He spends most of his time with her in the home. After eating dinner with her he goes home once she's asleep. In the summer time he enjoys golfing 2 or 3 times a week, and when it turns cold he likes to go for walks every day. Bill and Marj have three children, with two of the families in Denver. He tries to visit them twice a year in Colorado. In June the whole gang (including all three children's families) spend two weeks in Cape Cod.

The Ruggs were active members of Central Presbyterian Church from 1957 until it was closed. At the time of the closing Bill was President of the Trustees and Chairman of the Committee to sell the church. Most of the members moved to First Presbyterian Church. Bill and Marj were familiar with Tracy from when she was associate minister at Central. They decided to join UPC, but he wasn't able to become a member until the sale went through on their former church since he was the President of the Central Church Trustees. It was a natural move to UPC because of its convenient location to them but mostly because they fell in love with Tracy when she was at Central.

Due to Marj's health problems Bill hasn't had time to get involved with the church. Prior to her sickness Bill worked on the finance committee that recommends how UPC's endowments should be invested. During his fifty years with Central, he served two three year terms as a Deacon, and several of the years as moderator. He also served two terms as Elder, 13 years as a Trustee and two years as both President and Treasurer. (elders and trustees were totally separate). He also served six years as President.

Bill has always tried to model his life as a Christian, and is sure that many of his better decisions are the result of trying to think as a Christian.
