Pastor's Column

I've been doing a lot of reading about Australia in anticipation of my sabbatical trip there in July. Some of the books focus on the Aboriginal Australians concept of what we Westerners would call "spirituality." In the traditional aboriginal understanding, there is no divide between the sacred and the everyday world. Locations on the landscape, objects, animals are all places where the sacred resides.

We Westerners have a harder time grasping this concept in our lives. Our hectic lives, our disconnect with nature, our reliance upon technology all contribute to a divide between the sacred and the mundane. And we find that we have to be intentional in order to overcome this divide.

Lent offers such an occasion for Christians. These six weeks before Easter can provide an excellent opportunity to deepen our connection to God's sacred presence. And we can achieve this in many very simple and "do-able" ways: ten minutes for prayer or meditation a day, attending special worship opportunities, joining a Bible study, starting a prayer journal are all some basic examples of practices that can help re-establish or deepen our relationship with God.

This Lent, UPC provides some opportunities for our members and friends to re-connect to the Sacred Presence: Ash Wednesday service, our monthly Taize services, the Adult class series on forgiveness are a few examples. You are invited to join us in these activities or to discover your own practices of walking ever closely with your God.
