## Pastor's Column

We do not typically think of Lent as a season of joy. Christmas is a joyful season. Easter is a joyful season. But not Lent. Lent is a time for serious reflection, of denial, of repentance for our sins.

But why not joy? Why wouldn't orienting our lives toward God be an occasion of joy? Why wouldn't we be filled with gratitude for the mercy we are shown by God and for the affirmation of God's unconditional love for us, while we are yet sinners?

As part of our conversations regarding the future of University Presbyterian Church, the Session has begun reflecting on this topic of joy. We have discussed how sometimes we lose track of the joy of our faith and ministry in the midst of solving some of the challenging problems of our congregation and in our efforts to do the necessary support work for our congregation's ministries. Yet, it is important that whatever new directions our congregation may take, that we do so with a sense of joy. The Westminster Shorter Catechism (one of the affirmations of faith in the Presbyterian Church's Book of Confessions), asks this question (slightly edited for inclusive language):

*What is the chief end of humanity?* The answer given: *To glorify God and enjoy God forever.* Imagine what your life or our congregational life might look like if we took seriously that our purpose in life is to glorify God and to *enjoy* God.

Lent is a call to return to faithful living, which includes practices, habits, and disciplines which are to glorify and enjoy God. This Lenten season, may we discover the joy of walking with God.

## Lunch For University Student Fellowship

The Ministry with University Students Committee invites members of the congregation **to provide lunch or funding** to cover the cost of lunch for the University Student Fellowship on **Sundays at 12:15 PM.**

Adonation of \$30 will cover lunch for one Sunday. Payment is needed one week in advance and may be submitted via the offering plate with a designation for "University Student Lunches."

If preparing a meal, one person may bring the main course, another dessert and beverage, or one person may bring the entire meal. Though the number of students varies, please plan food for 8-10.

Simple foods work best. For the main course, sandwich fixings, a crockpot of chili or soup, or a casserole would be ideal. For dessert, fruit is an option, and other desserts need not be homemade. A 2-liter bottle of pop is the perfect beverage. Paper products and cutlery are provided, so you need not bring those. However, a ladle is appreciated for soup or chili.

**This year we have a vegetarian student and one who has a gluten allergy, so it would be helpful to take this into consideration when preparing meals. Perhaps meat could be served separately and at least some components of the meal could be gluten-free.**

Those who provide the lunch are encouraged to eat with the students.

There is a sign-up sheet in the Holzwarth Room for the fall semester. Please help us fulfill our mission of ministering to the university students in our midst by facilitating their fellowship over lunch before they begin their weekly study topic.
