Pastor's Column

Sometimes we best experience gratitude in terms of contrast. When our days are chaotic, filled with noise and too many people, then we are grateful for a moment of quiet solitude. Yet, if we know great loneliness and days by ourselves, then we may be grateful for the companionship of others. It is when we are confronted with death that we often are able to cherish life and all the small and large things in life that are precious to us. After 9/11 we all held our children and loved ones a little more tightly. People who have endured great hardships are often those who have a strong sense of gratitude for the blessings they have in life.

Gratitude born out of a sense of contrast is found in the Bible as well. The Hebrew people were often reminded to “remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt,” and how God delivered them from their suffering. This remembrance is intended to fuel gratitude for what they have and to motivate them to live kind, generous, and faithful lives. Every time we come to the communion table we are invited to remember a contrast. Once we were slaves to fear, sin, and death, but because of Christ's love we are freed to live differently—as resurrected people, who live grateful lives of service and compassion.

In this season of Thanksgiving, maybe we would benefit by recollecting some of our own personal and collective contrasts so that such recollections may fuel in us a sense of gratitude and transform how we live and love.

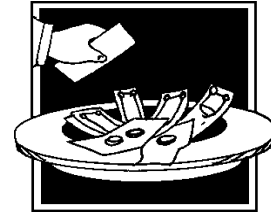
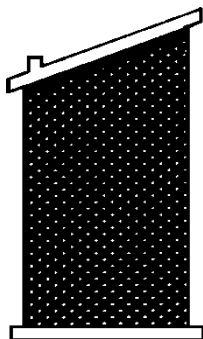

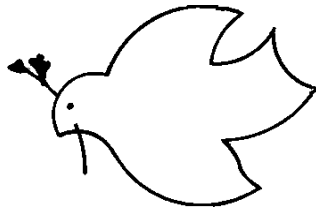
Remember In Your Prayers

Please remember also in your prayers David and Diane Walker, whose daughter Lisa died after a long battle with cancer. Grieving Lisa's death are also her husband and three children.



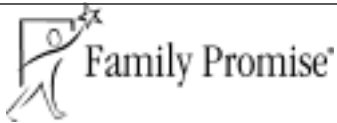
Adult Christian Education Class

UPC Becomes a Family Promise Support Church to Help Homeless Families in WNY. Could you lend a hand?

The mission of **Family Promise of Western New York** (Interfaith Hospitality Network) is to unite faith based and other organizations in a collaborative response to the needs of homeless families in our community. Family Promise provides temporary shelter, meals, and assistance for homeless families with children while they seek stability and independence. Family Promise is unique in providing shelter to families, keeping even two parent families intact

The Family Promise host and support congregations provide lodging, meals and hospitality for these families in need. **University Presbyterian Church has committed to be a support congregation to Crossroads Lutheran Church, Main Street in Snyder, during the week when they act as hosts to the homeless families in the Family Promise Program.**

As a support church, UPC is responsible, four times a year, to provide an evening meal for the families (4:30 to 7:30), to provide companionship during the evening hours (7:00 to 10:00), and if possible, to provide a couple to stay overnight at the church (9:30pm to 7:30 am).

Our first date as support church was to be Tuesday, October 19th, but the scheduled family found housing before we had a chance!

John Swaine (877-4868) has agreed to be our contact to help recruit volunteers and coordinate our activities with Crossroads Lutheran Church. Please consider volunteering to help out on one of the upcoming dates. We will be telling you more about this opportunity as the dates get closer.

In our country, 1 in every 50 children has experienced homelessness. In Family Promise of WNY, the face of homelessness becomes personal and the call to hospitality to “the least of these” is real.
