Pastor's Column

September 9th is Rally Day—the day we typically launch the beginning of our new program year. This year's Rally Day, however, is a “new beginning” in more ways than one. UPC has joined a denominational program called “New Beginnings.” This program is designed to help congregations explore what new beginnings God might have in mind for them. On September 9th UPC will launch a series of conversations within the congregation so that all our members and friends can offer their insight and wisdom to this journey. We will gather for worship, as usual, but there will be a few changes to our typical Sunday morning. Here are some of the changes for that day.

What you can expect on September 9th:

—a single worship service will be held at 10 a.m. (NOT our typical 9 a.m. and 11 a.m.)

Our usual program year schedule, with two services at 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. and the education hour at 10 a.m., will resume the following week, September 16

—the conventional worship service will be abbreviated, approximately 30-40 minutes, to allow us to worship God through our conversations and deliberations. The collective discernment of how we can be faithful to God's call in this time and place is indeed another form of worship

—everyone at church, members and friends, will be invited to join one of 7 small groups stationed around the church building. These groups will use the New Beginning's report of our church, prepared by the denominational consultants, as a tool for beginning these conversations.

—the small groups will last approximately 90 minutes

—a light lunch will be offered

—activities will be provided for younger children during the small group time

—the small groups will conclude by 12:30 p.m., in time for folks to get home for the Bill's game at 1 p.m.!

We hope you will attend on September 9th and join your voice to these important discussions about the future of UPC. The September 9th conversations are just the first of 6 small gatherings. The remainder of those gatherings will occur on week nights and week days throughout the fall. Please take a look at the enclosed schedule of the small group meetings and find a day and time that works best for you. Even if you can't attend all 5 gatherings, please attempt to join as many as possible. **The future of UPC will be shaped by the Spirit working through all of us—yes, through YOU!**

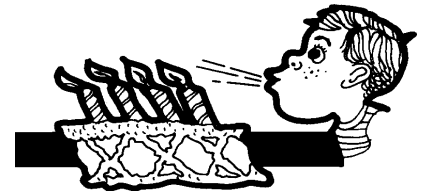

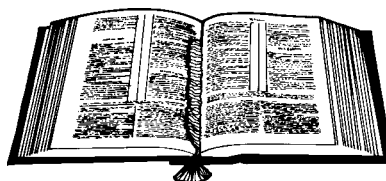

This month we're going to get to know Joan Secor who has been attending UPC around 50 years. Joan was born in Buffalo and raised on the north side of the city. She grew up on Admiral St. and attended P.S. 66, and then Bennett H.S. She got her B.A. at Buffalo State to be an art teacher, and also attended Albright Art School. She taught elementary ed. in Scotia (near Schenectady) and then back in Buffalo at Kenmore Middle School. While attending Albright Art School she met her husband Bert who was taking commercial art.

They were married for 54 years and have two sons. Joan returned to the work force when her sons were older, and taught at 3 Catholic schools, St Bartholomew's, St Gregory's, and Mt St Joseph's on Main St. After retiring she worked for 16 years as a docent at the zoo.

Since moving to Presbyterian Village, she has taken up gardening, and enjoys doing crossword puzzles. She utilizes her creative side by making homemade birthday cards for friends and relatives. She uses mixed media for her creations and likes to use dried flowers and plants in her Hallmark masterpieces.

She has been an active member in many capacities and roles in the church. The associate minister tried to convince her to teach Sunday school when her sons were young. She and Bert went to Synod school and they enjoyed it so much they attended it for 8 years. Her faith has grown stronger through the years, and she has served on the session, worship and education committee, and helped initiate the contemporary worship service.

Christian Education Opportunities This Fall

The Christian Education program will begin for all ages on **Sunday, September 16 at 10 a.m.**

Children's Class:

Children (ages 5 years through 7th grade) will meet in a multi-aged class, taught by a team of rotating teachers. Class time will start with music, offered by Tiffany Whitefield, collective time as an entire group, followed by smaller groups for age-based activities.

Teachers this fall will be: Marge Waldron (Sept. 16-Oct. 7), Amy Erikson (Oct. 14-Nov. 18), and Ginna Coon (Dec. 2-23). Jude Hammer and Sandy Robertson will alternate as classroom aides.

Adult Class:

The Adult Class will begin on September 16 with a guest speaker, She is Nicole Gowel (Ga-wool), Development Assistant at FONP. She organizes volunteers, helps plan events, speakers to churches, companies, schools etc. to garner volunteers & find further funding. She will inform us about opportunities to volunteer at FONP, Urban Diner at Hope Center and Salvation Army Soup Kitchen at 21 Westminster Ave.

The remaining Sundays in the fall semester will be taught by Dr. Timothy Wadkins, Professor of Religious Studies at Canisius College. Dr. Wadkins, always a popular and engaging teacher, will lead us in a discussion of the following topic:

“The Good, the Bad and the Ugly: The Bible and Christian Faith”

Part history, part theology, and part autobiography, this series will discuss questions about the Bible in the context of faith. How exactly are we to understand the role of the Bible in Christian history? What does it mean to affirm the inspiration and authority of Scripture? How should the Bible be interpreted? What are we to do about difficult parts of the Bible, such as those which depict infant sacrifice or genocide in God's name? All of these questions and more will be addressed in this series.

Come join in what promises to be a most stimulating conversation!
