The season for giving thanks is upon us. During this time of year, we are invited to take stock of all those things for which we are grateful. Often these "gratitude" inventories are comprised of things or people we have in our lives for which we are thankful: family, friends, health, material comforts, etc.

Yet, maybe Thanksgiving can also be a time to reflect upon a different kind of gratitude. Rather than accounting only for those things we *have* (relationships or comforts), what if we contemplated the things we get to *do* or *be*? What about the opportunities we are given to be God's hands to help others, to serve others? What about being grateful that we can be a friend, parent, spouse, sister, son, etc? **Once again the Deacons will be hosting a soup and pie luncheon.**

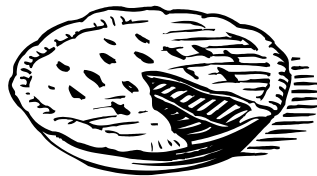

## A Blessed Summer of Novels

Instead, after a restful forest summer prepping my heart for my poetry, taking photos, and reading several of Francine Rivers' books, I was refreshed in my spirit. I'd finish one, then order another on my Kindle, after thinking, "No, I really should get some school prep done." Truly, the prep in my heart makes for a better learning experience for the students. It's been good.

The hand of God is in the historical and fictional characters as they all represent me, a part of me; choices I've made or thought about making; words I've said. I hear the author's personal loss and salvation story in them, but find my own there too. It is providential that a leader from our forest community where we had a difficult year of discord, leant me "The Sin-Eater". I found myself praying more for my own heart to change towards those with opposing views, and that in the negative, I would still find some good.

The next books challenged me gently: "Redeeming Love" and then the "Mark of the Lion" collection. They stirred me to notice again the stuff I tuck away: those fears and attitudes I stubbornly push back to the dark corners of my heart. What a gift! Inspired words can certainly tap us on the shoulder to look up from our sorry messes to the Love that loves us anyway.

God's light continues to surprise me and reveal fresh learning. These stories are definitely more than creative and vibrant in their descriptions. The characters are me. They're people I know. The Heavenly Father I haven't always honored, listened to, or obeyed, knows when my heart is ready for a fresh lesson or reminder. It is an undeserved blessing that He watches over me and provides me with what I need at just the right time. He is the Word!
